



Memorandum

Meeting of the Students' Feedback Subcommittee
on October 16, 2018. from 2 p.m. at the Kenézy Villa

Professor Zoltán Papp: greeted those present. He said that the meeting would proceed according to the posted agenda.

I. Agenda: feedback results of the 1st semester of the academic year 2017/2018.

Pál Pap, Head of the Registrar's Office, presented the feedback results of the academic year 2017/2018. (see attachment I.). He explained that questionnaires for block practical were filled by 81% of Hungarian students and 71% of English students, which is a very good ratio. It can be said that the new system works successfully. All in all the values given by the students are around 4 for each block practice subject on the five-grade scale. Only some subjects received less than grade four (Emergency Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics). The results would be sent to the concerned departments later.

For the 6th year English program students the completed questioners did not reach the 30%, so the results are not representative. In their case, the introduction of the bonus system did not produce any result.

There was also a good number of feedbacks on divided program. However, in the case of English program students of Molecular Biology the fill in rate has not reached the 30%. This ratio was also under than 30% in the case of four questionnaires, for the Hungarian students of Molecular Biology. So the results in these questionnaires cannot be considered as representative either. (see attachment I.)

Professor Zoltán Papp, thanked the presentation of the results. He explained that the presentation would be available on the website, as has been before. He asked if there was any comment or suggestion from someone.

Firas Odeh student of the English program noted that perhaps if there were less questions in the questionnaire, a larger number of fills would be available. He said that not always the same teacher would keep the lessons, so they cannot enter the teacher's name on the form.



Pál Pap Head of the Registrar's Office explained that the questioners were already included the reduced number of questions (maximum of 10 questions). In previous meeting, the Committee has already accepted this. He also said that when filling in the questionnaire, students has possibility to choose a select a tab ("other") and typing in the teacher's name. This was already available before.

II. **Agenda: Suggestions for refining the bonus system. Use a total of five bonus questionnaires.**

Firas Odeh student of the English program noted, that there are still many students who cannot use the bonus system, because there are not as many available questionnaires as they need to enforce the bonus.

Pál Pap Head of the Registrar's Office stated that based on student suggestions the bonus system would be refined. Five bonus questionnaires would be created. With this change, the bonus system would be available for all students.

Members of the committee unanimously supported the proposals to have five extra questioners instead of two.

III. **Agenda: Others.**

There were no more comments.

Professor Zoltán Papp thanked for the attendance and closed the meeting.
