Assessment:

The questionnaire is only valid on the day it is signed. Departments may also decide to take students' temperature on spot.

During the pandemic a separate questionnaire should be filled in (every day) and submitted before the start of each practical / block practice / seminar / examination. The questionnaire may be archived by the department online as a picture, or as a paper-based document.

If the answer to any of the questions is yes, or a body temperature higher than 37.5 C was measured, the student cannot be admitted to examination/practice/grade offering test. (*If any of the above symptoms are clearly known and of non-infectious origin* (e.g. allergy, migraine, Crohn's disease, etc., they should not be considered. Diarrhea is defined as the emptying of at least 3 loose stools in 24 hours.)

If a microbiological test has been performed and the student has some symptoms or positive epidemiological findings, or there are circumstances justifying individual assessment, the primary care provider (GP) must be contacted in advance regarding the student's admission to examination (appointment should be made by phone). If needed, the physician may refer the student to an infectologist or request an infectological consultation. In case of severe complaints, students must contact (in advance, over the phone) their primary care provider or the emergency room.
